## Field School Results—Preview

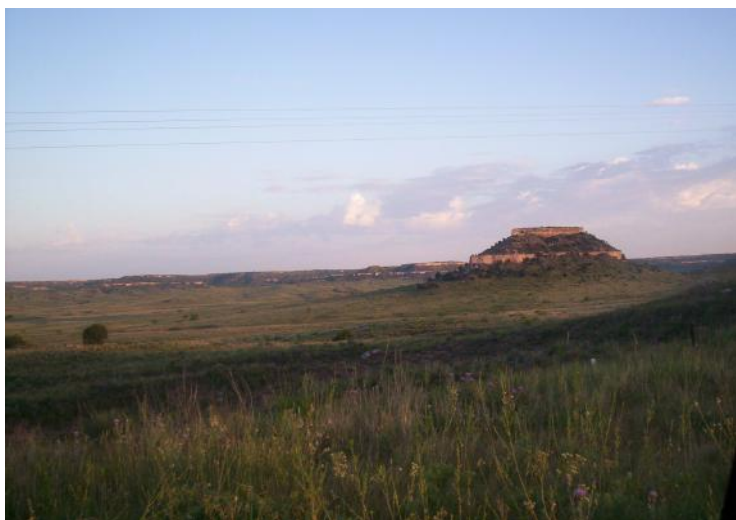
**Doris Howard**

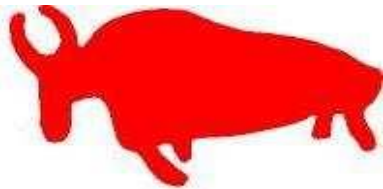
