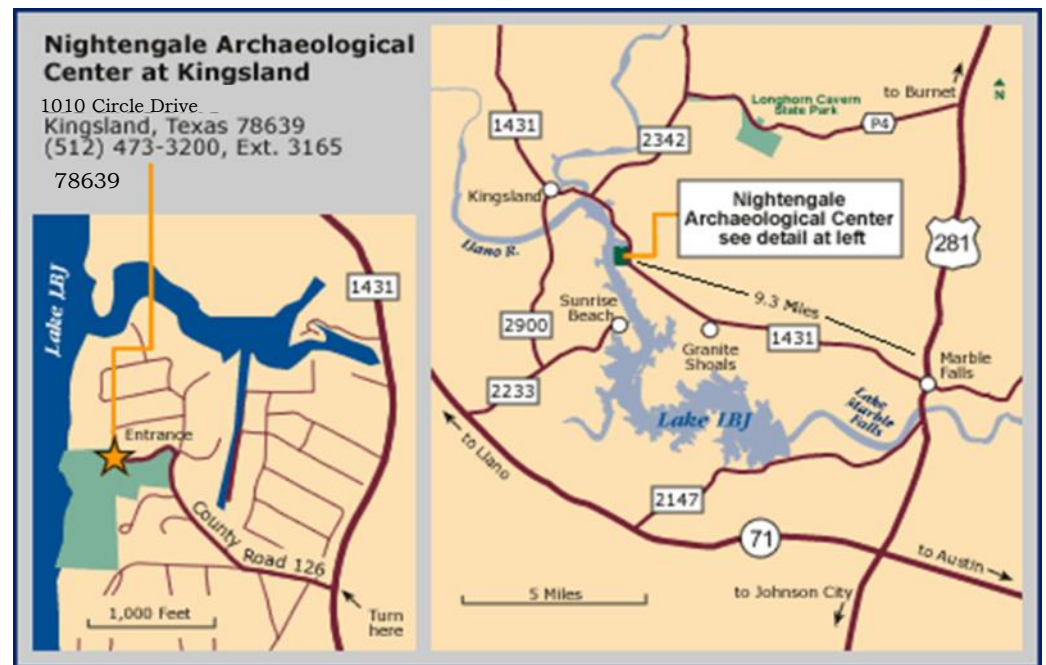
We have done this to lessen the amount of night travel. We hope that we will attract new members, as well. And to be more attractive to potential speakers.

### Directions via FM1431 from Marble Falls or Kingsland:

**Turn** at sign for **Twin Isles Subdivision**. This is 9.3 miles from Marble Falls or 3.1 from Kingsland. Go about 500ft and **bear right (look for sign)** staying on Co Rd 126, go about 0.2 mile and **turn left** on to Circle drive. Drive about 300 ft to entrance gate of **Nightengale Archaeological Center/LUAS**.
