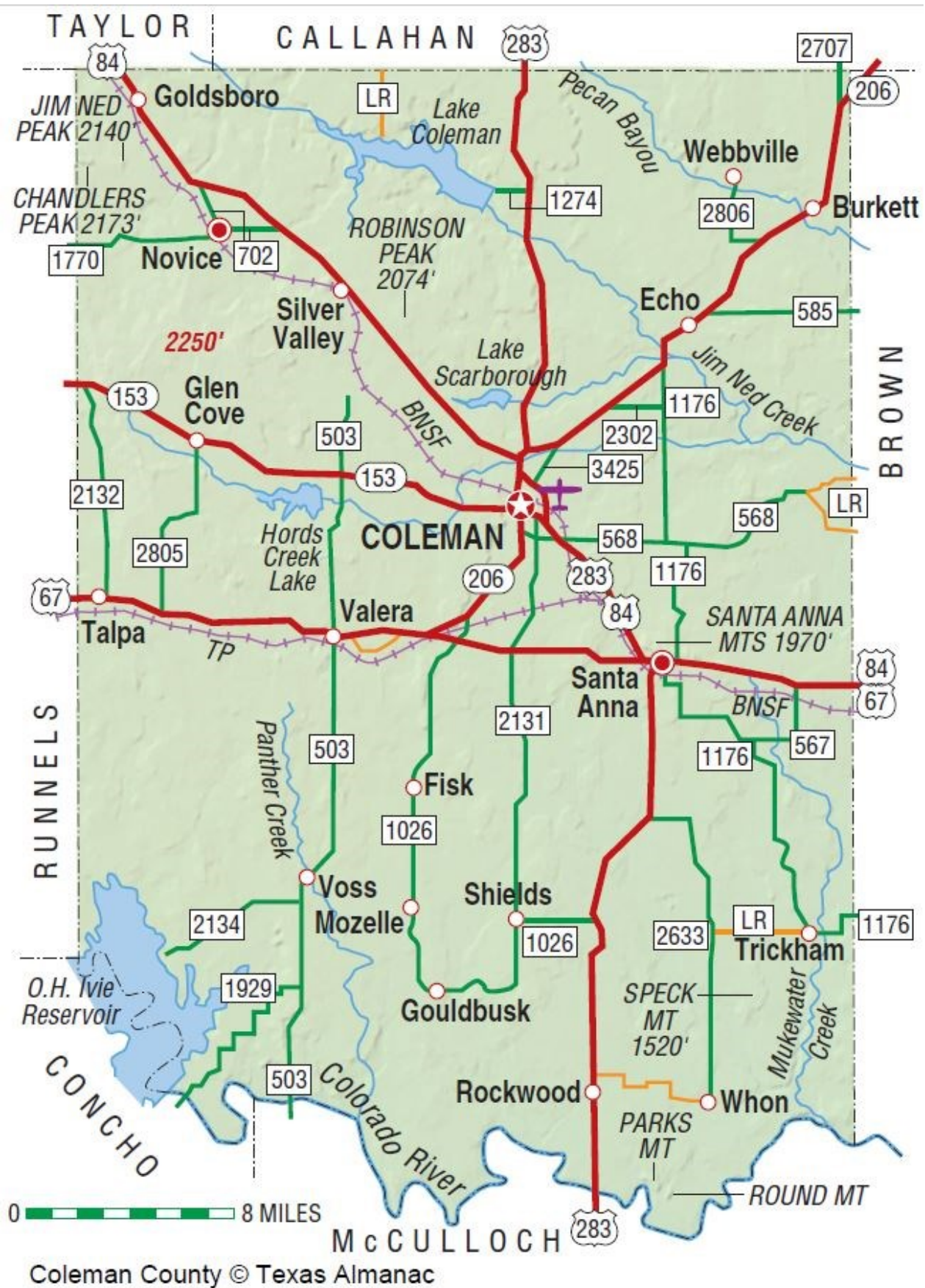
The next LUAS meeting will be Saturday,
September 10th, 2022 at 12:00

Our speaker will be **Dr. Chris Lintz**, currently a **Research Associate at the Center for Archaeological Studies at Texas State University** in San Marcos.

He will present an old fashioned slide show on the many facets of the 1988-89 investigations at the **O.H. Ivie Reservoir** at the confluence of the Concho and Colorado Rivers, ranging from conducting oral histories, relocating cemeteries, compiling architectural drawings on buildings and structures, and physically removing the Mable Doss Day House from the reservoir basin. The work also included large-scale excavations of 8 prehistoric and 9 historic sites.



O. H. Ivie Reservoir (formerly known as Stacy Reservoir) and the Simon. W. Freese Dam is located five miles north of Millersview in Coleman County and extended in Concho, Coleman, and Runnels counties, on the Colorado River just sixteen miles below the confluence of Concho River and the Colorado River.

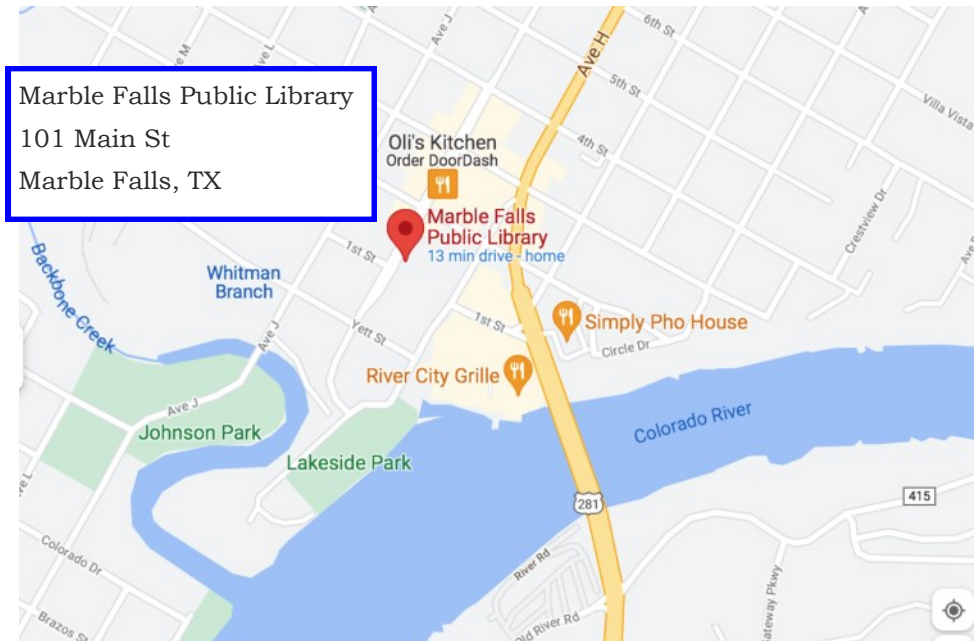
